WHEREAS, as a result of the heavy rains sustained over a short period of time during storms in early March 2011; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the heavy rainfall a sink hole occurred adjacent to the bridge that carries Broad Brook under Harris Road, between Beaver Dam Road and Babbitt Road, a major thoroughfare in the Town of Bedford, with two (2) correctional facilities on this portion of the road; and

WHEREAS, for the health, safety and welfare of those travelling along this road, the bridge was determined to be unsafe and the road closed;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Board does hereby acknowledge the public emergency with regard to the bridge on Harris Road, which carries Broad Brook under the road, in the portion between Beaver Dam Road and Babbitt Road.

WHEREAS it has come to the attention of the Town Board of the Town of Bedford that the bridge wall of the Harris Road bridge over Broad Brook had been undermined and damaged by recent heavy rainfall; and

WHEREAS the impact to the travelling public and Taconic and Bedford Hills Correctional Facilities is significant, is a serious situation and needs to be handled on an emergency basis; and

WHEREAS the Deputy Supervisor was notified of this situation on March 23, 2011 and approval was sought and granted under General Municipal Law § 103(4) which allows for a statutory exemption from competitive bidding in the case of a public emergency arising out of an accident or other unforeseen occurrence or condition in public buildings, on public property or the life, health, safety of property of the inhabitants of a political subdivision, requires immediate action, which cannot await public bidding;

THEREFORE, NOW BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby declare a Public Emergency with respect to the Harris Road bridge repair; and it is further

RESOLVED that under General Municipal Law § 103 (4) because of the public emergency, immediate action is required and the completion of the project cannot await competitive bidding; and it is further

RESOLVED that the Commissioner of Public Works is hereby authorized to retain contractors to complete the project to ensure public safety; and

BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED that any and all actions heretofore taken by any Town of Bedford officials in furtherance of this resolution are ratified and confirmed.

WHEREAS, for many years there have been two (2) vital records districts in the Town of Bedford, one being the Bedford Hills Correctional Facility – District 5992 and the other being the Town of Bedford – District 5950; and

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk of the Town of Bedford has served as the Registrar of Vital Statistics for both districts since the mid – 1980’s; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4120.2(a) of the New York State Public Health Law, the New York State Commissioner of Health may with the approval of the Westchester County Board of Legislators, combine these two (2) primary registration districts; and

WHEREAS, by letter dated June 21, 2010, the Town Clerk of the Town of Bedford, Lisbeth Fumagalli, petitioned the Westchester County Board of Legislators to support the consolidation of the Bedford Hills Correctional Facility Primary Registration District with the Town of Bedford Primary Registration District for the purpose of reporting and recording vital statistics; and

WHEREAS, the Westchester County Board of Legislators by Resolution No. 122/2010 dated September 13, 2010 supported the consolidation of the Bedford Hills Correctional Facility Primary Registration District – 5992 with the Town of Bedford Primary Registration District – 5950; and

WHEREAS, by order dated March 21, 2011 Nirav R. Shah, M.D., Commissioner of Health for the New York State Department of Health, ordered the consolidation of Bedford Hills Correctional Facility Primary Registration District – 5992 with the Town of Bedford Primary Registration District – 5950 and with all vital records to be maintained by the Town of Bedford Registrar of Vital Statistics,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT

THE Town Board of the Town of Bedford does hereby recognize the consolidation of the Bedford Hills Correctional Facility Primary Registration District – 5992 with the Town of Bedford Primary Registration District – 5950, to one Primary Registration District for the Town of Bedford 5950.

WHEREAS, the East of Hudson municipalities from Putnam and Westchester Counties are attempting to avoid the significant costs of implementing the MS 4 Stormwater Retrofit Program mandated by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC); and

WHEREAS, said Retrofit Program will cost the Town of Bedford as well as other East of Hudson municipalities significant amounts of money unless funding can be obtained for the Retrofit Program from the New York City Department of Environmental Protection (NYCDEP); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bedford, along with other East of Hudson Municipalities, has determined that there is a need for a unified entity to negotiate with NYCDEP and ultimately administer the funds which the East of Hudson municipalities will hopefully be receiving from NYCDEP; and

WHEREAS, pursuant thereto, an Intermunicipal Agreement for the East of Hudson Coalition has been drafted which Agreement provides for mutual cooperation among a number of towns and villages located in the New York City Watershed, east of the Hudson River, in both Westchester and Putnam Counties; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bedford and other East of Hudson municipalities wish to foster cooperation, seek additional funding and provide the provision of joint services related to compliance with the requirements of the MS 4 Program; and

WHEREAS, the East of Hudson municipalities believe it to be in their best interests to share any costs, including legal costs, necessary to acquire adequate funding from NYCDEP for the MS 4 Programs being mandated by the New York State and Federal Government; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Bedford has reviewed a draft Intermunicipal Agreement for the East of Hudson municipalities which are named in said draft Intermunicipal Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board believes that it is in the interests of the Town of Bedford to enter into such Intermunicipal Agreement with the other East of Hudson municipalities named therein, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the entering into of an Intermunicipal Agreement between the Town of Bedford and the other Towns and Villages of the East of Hudson Coalition constitutes an “unlisted action” under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”) and will not have any significant adverse effect upon the environment; and

RESOLVED, according the Town Board of the Town of Bedford hereby issues a “negative declaration” pursuant to the requirements of SEQRA in regard to the entering into of such proposed Intermunicipal Agreement; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Bedford hereby approves the Town entering into an Intermunicipal Agreement in regard to the MS 4 requirements, a copy of which proposed Intermunicipal Agreement is annexed hereto; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Supervisor on behalf of the Town Board of the Town of Bedford is authorized to sign such Intermunicipal Agreement and take such other further steps on behalf of the Town of Bedford as are necessary in order to protect the interests of the Town of Bedford in regard to furthering the goals of the East of Hudson Coalition; and it is further
